While we spent 2020 basically getting organized and putting the foundation for our organization in place, 2021 was effectively our first year of operation and the year in which we began enrolling students to help them achieve their education and employment goals.

And what a year it has been! We engaged over 100 students and built working partnerships with our colleagues at Winchester Public Schools, Laurel Ridge Community College (formerly LFCC), and Shenandoah University, along with many great community organizations and individuals too numerous to name here. As has been said, it will take everyone working as a team if we are to help ALL students set and achieve goals for a prosperous future built on a relevant education and personal skill set.

Our board of trustees grew to a total of nine trustees as we welcomed Kristina Boulweiri, Bernard Mustafa, Lorna Magill and Rod Williams to our ranks. They have proven to be wonderful additions bringing new ideas and energetic support in all areas. We began our fundraising efforts and now count a growing number of supporters who have stepped forward to make our vision of "empowering EVERY student with the tools for success" a reality.

The most exciting news to share however is that we have incredible plans for the future. Opportunity Scholars plans to enroll AT LEAST 1,000 STUDENTS by 2025. We aim to CUT IN HALF the number of kids who leave an Opportunity Scholars high school without a career path to a high-wage, high-demand profession!! Finally, we seek to produce over 1,000 new skilled workers for LOCAL businesses to grow and help our LOCAL communities attract new businesses to make every person part of this great education-enabled US economy.

In 2022 we plan to expand into Frederick County, Clarke County and Loudoun County, doubling the number of students we serve. We are in active discussions with all the needed partners to make this growth plan a reality. As the pandemic recedes (he said hopefully), we anticipate fully utilizing the new Opportunity Scholars offices opened this year in Winchester and growing our programs there while we expand into new geography simultaneously.

2021: GREAT LAUNCH AND CONTINUED MOMENTUM!

Despite COVID interrupting school schedules, the 2021 Opportunity Scholars launch was a great success. We began functioning operationally and connecting with interested students and their families in the first quarter of 2021 and subsequently greatly surpassed our end-of-year goal of 50 students admitted to the program.

In July, Opportunity Scholars held its first Career Camp — a considerable achievement with more than 60 students and their families attending. Attendees learned how Opportunity Scholars can support and guide them toward successful careers, listened to inspirational speakers, and interacted with successful technical and professional workers.

Opportunity Scholars hosted a dinner at Shenandoah University with Washington Football Great Ken Harvey as our dynamic and inspirational keynote speaker. Approximately 200 students, families and staff attended.

By the end of 2021, 89 students were involved in our program at varying levels, with another 15 students in the admission assessment process.

Opportunity Scholars' Education Fund supported:

- Students taking dual enrollment classes
- Students enrolled at Laurel Ridge Community College (formerly LFCC)
- Students enrolled at Shenandoah University

Current career paths among our students include:

- Electrician
- Cybersecurity Technician
- Associate Degree in Nursing
- Accounting
- Dental Hygiene
- Computer Aided Design

SCHOLAR DEMOGRAPHICS

The following data demonstrates 2021 end-of-year scholar representation in the categories of income/socioeconomic standing, parent education level, ethnicity/race and gender.

TOTAL NUMBER OF STUDENTS WE HAVE ENGAGED: 89

Family Income

Based on information gathered from our students' Free Applications for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), Summary Aid Reports (SAR) and Estimated Family Contribution (EFC):

- 85% of our students are from low-income socioeconomic backgrounds.
- 15% fall into a lower middle-income bracket.

Family Background

- 90% of our scholars report that they will be first-generation college attendees.
 - More than 60% of our scholars' parents attained education no further than middle-school level.
 - 30% of our scholars' parents are high school graduates.
 - 10% of our scholars' parents pursued some college or a certificate program.
- Hispanic scholars are among the population whose parents have the least education and highest financial need.

Ethnicity/Race

- Approximately 86.5% are minority students, broken down by numbers of students here:
 - 56 Hispanic-Latino
 - 12 African American
 - ∘ 4 Bi-racial
 - 17 White

Gender

• Out of 89 scholars, 49 are female and 40 are male.

2021 FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

Because 2021 was essentially the first full year of operation for Opportunity Scholars, most funds raised were used to build the Education Fund.

The Education Fund pays for the expenses of Opportunity Scholars students while they are engaged in career and technical training and in their studies at Community College and/or University. Since there are a rapidly growing number of students in the OS program, much of the Education Fund is already committed to their future education expenses. There is an urgent need to increase donations to this fund as we increase the number of students enrolled in the OS program.
